



PhD Scholarship in Comparative Trusts Law Joint PhD at the Universities of Melbourne and Bonn (Melbourne-Based Project)

What? A fully-funded joint PhD project on comparative trusts law as part of a new research collaboration on “**Trusts Across the Civil Law/Common Law Divide**”.

Thesis topic (to be further tailored to the skillset of the successful candidate):

**“Trusts Across the Asia-Pacific Civil Law/Common Law Divide:
Challenges and Opportunities”**

Where? Based at the University of Melbourne (Melbourne Law School) with a minimum 12-month stay at the University of Bonn.

Supervision: Jointly by Prof. Ying Khai Liew (Melbourne) and Prof. Birke Häcker (Bonn).

When? Starting 1 October 2025 (anticipated start date).

Duration: 3 (max. 4) years.

Eligibility: University-level law degree with distinction and excellent proficiency in English.

Applications are open now and may close early once a suitable candidate is identified. Interested candidates are encouraged to submit their applications as soon as possible.
